Shrove Tuesday and Pancake Day

In the UK, Shrove Tuesday, also known as Pancake Day, falls on Tuesday 17th February 2026, the day before Ash Wednesday, marking the traditional last day of feasting before Lent begins, with celebrations involving pancakes and often pancake races. It's the final day for indulging in rich foods like eggs, butter, and sugar before the Lenten fast starts the next day (Ash Wednesday). Traditions are making and eating pancakes and using up pantry staples such as eggs, milk and sugar before Lent. The day often involves pancake races and enjoying various sweet toppings.

Perfect Pancake Recipe

Ingredients:

100g plain flour
Pinch salt
2 eggs
300ml semi skimmed milk
1 tbsp sunflower oil



Method

- Put a large non-stick frying pan on a medium high heat.
- Add plain flour and a pinch of salt into a large mixing bowl, make a well in the centre and crack 2 eggs into the middle.
- Pour in about 50ml from the 300ml of semi-skimmed milk and 1 tbsp sunflower oil the start whisking from the centre, gradually drawing the flour into the eggs, milk and oil. Once all the flour is incorporated, beat until you have a smooth, thick paste.
- Add a good splash of milk and whisk to loosen the thick batter.
- While still whisking, pour in a steady stream of the remaining milk. Continue pouring and whisking until you have a combined batter.
- Ladle some batter into the pan, tilting the pan to move the mixture around for a thin and even layer
- Leave to cook, undisturbed, for about 30 seconds .
- Hold the pan handle,, ease a palette knife under the pancake, then quickly lift and flip it over. Make sure the pancake is lying flat against the base of the pan with no folds, then cook for another 30 secs before turning out onto a warm plate
- Continue with the rest of the batter, serving them as you cook or stack onto a plate

January's subject for the monthly meeting was' Imaging '. Not sure what this conjures up in one's minds but what we used to call Xray or Radiology is now all called Imaging. Simon Waddington, now retired, but having spent a lifetime working in hospitals, shared his wide knowledge of all the machines and systems used to get these images to establish the broad variety of health problems. All digital images are stored in the cloud which amounts to billions, the archives are huge. Simon showed photos of the categories used: Plain Film, Xrays, Dexa and Dental, Forensics, Fluoroscopy , CT Scan, MRI, Ultrasound and Nuclear Medicine. We were shown many photos, challenging us to identify what they were. Simon continued by explaining the particular problem it showed, highlighting the skills needed by the professionals to read the results and pass details on to Doctors and consultants prior to a decision on the patient's diagnosis and what an important part Imaging plays. Naomi Finch thanked Simon.





PARISH TAXI SCHEME—FOR RESIDENTS OF LEZANT PARISH ONLY

If you are a resident of Lezant Parish, you can claim a subsidy for any taxi journey using Launceston Taxis. (Please note: the taxi cannot be used on a regular basis for commuting between home and work, nor as a school-run vehicle.)

From 01 December 2024 the subsidy will be increased to £7 per single journey (you can also claim £7 for the return journey, if applicable). Please note this increase will be for a limited time only in order to use up reserves - once the grant is exhausted the subsidy will be lowered. Please check the magazine for any updates or contact the clerk. To take advantage of the scheme the taxi must be pre-booked through Launceston Taxis on 07340 813434. The taxi driver will have a form that he will complete. You sign the form and pay the reduced rate to the driver. Please note that the single fares quoted below are for guidance only, and may differ depending on where you are being picked up/ dropped off:

IN OUR GARDEN - THE VIRGIN QUEEN

We are all familiar with ants, occasionally coming in to our houses or larders, looking for scraps, especially sweet. These are the black garden ant. We all know honey bees have queens but few of us realise ants have a Queen too.

Generally speaking, ants live on nectar, tree sap and are famous for eating honey dew, a rather lovely name for the excretion of aphids, the gardener's enemy. They even defend them from enemies. Nests are usually under stones, in rockers or under flag stones on patios.

My memory was jerked when sitting in the sunshine on our patio recently. I noticed ants with wings coming up between the cracks. Clouds of them. Males mate with the Virgin Queens from other areas in mid-air while the workers, all non-breeding females mill about on the ground. The queen now seeks a suitable place for her colony to be started. She bites or knocks off her wings. The male has done his duty and dies, the queen lays eggs. There are different chambers, housing eggs, larvae and pupa (the equivalent of eggs, caterpillars and chrysalids in butterflies).

The non breeding workers keep the eggs clean by 'licking' them and turning them. When hatched the workers feed the larvae with sugars and liquefied insects. They in turn change into pupae housed in small cocoons. (We used to erroneously call these ants eggs for fish food). Eventually the ant hatches. The queen continues to lay eggs, her only job.

About a year on from the start on a hot thundery day the ants having developed wings swarm in the air, the new generation males and a foreign queen will mate and start all over again.
